

WORK-BASED LEARNING

The Board shall provide an education for employment program for elementary and secondary students which has been developed in accordance with state guidelines and has been approved by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction.

All students shall have access to an education for employment program which provides

1. Practical application of basic skills in the general and vocational curricula;
2. Community field experiences
3. Career exploration and planning
4. Training in job skills and attitudes that enhance employability;
5. Study of the practical application of economics
6. In grades 9 through 12, vocational education programs An awareness of the importance of lifelong learning.

The district superintendent, or designee, shall coordinate the education for employment program in accordance with state laws and regulations.
