I would like to thank our community for supporting the Frederic School District with the passing of the November 5 non-recurring operating cost referendum. The support is greatly appreciated. The funds will be used to sustain our current curriculum offerings and programs. We will also explore how to increase our offerings for our students.

Our initial step to increasing opportunities is to always review our use of our internal assets. We have many talented teachers. The district needs to utilize their skills to the maximum. The most influential method is to develop a great schedule grid of course offerings. This can be challenging since some of our staff teach different grade levels. Our administrative team will work diligently on this to provide what is best for our students.

Also, I have been meeting with superintendents from other area schools. The purpose is to explore if there are any prospects of sharing staff, classes or programs. While we each want to remain our own districts, there is value for our students in being good neighbors and working together. I have learned the practice of sharing programs between local districts has occurred in the past. There is no reason why a similar system can't be developed in today's educational environment.

As a community member you may ask what else you can do to support our students and their future? My recommendation would be to attend a school event. Kids love performing before a crowd. It does not matter if it is a musical concert, elementary event or an athletic game. Showing our youth that you support them by being present is wonderful.

Again, I want to thank you for supporting the November referendum. It is a pleasure to serve as the superintendent of the Frederic School District. - National Honor Society is a national organization to recognize individual student academic achievement
- The National Chapter was founded in 1921 by Principal Edward S. Rynearson
- It grew into roughly 1,000 chapters by 1930
- Over 1 million students participate in NHS or NJHS from all around the country. NHS chapters can also be found in Puerto Rico, Canada, and Asia
- All sophomores, juniors and seniors who have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.5 or above may apply for admission to the National Honor Society.

The Four Pillars of the National Honor Society

- **Scholarship:** a commitment to learning and growing on both a personal and educational path that stems from a desire to contribute to the world in a positive way.
- **Service:** seeking out and engaging in meaningful service voluntarily, not simply doing acts of service to fulfill a school, district, or program requirement, or to collect hours.
- **Leadership:** carrying oneself with dignity and taking ownership and responsibility for one's own actions and participation.
- **Character:** Valuing diverse cultures and building relationships that reflect love of self but also concern for others. It is about the personal commitment to ethical and compassionate decision making that affects oneself and other.

2024 FALL ATHLETICS RECAP



Cross Country: The Frederic-Luck Otters Cross Country team enjoyed an incredibly successful season. The Boys' team achieved impressive results in various meets, including a 2nd-place finish at the Conference meet and a 4th-place finish at the Sectional meet amidst strong competition. Notably, team member Zane Mattson from Luck qualified for the WIAA State Championship Meet, where he secured 26th place. Other members of Frederic's boys' team included Micah Roseanu, Soren Karl, and Abel Wetzig, while the girls' team featured Emily Hill and Clara Lundquist.

Football: The Football team boasted 30 players, the highest number since transitioning to 8-player football. They celebrated a victory over Luck for the first time since 2011 and won the Homecoming Game for the first time since 2019. The season concluded with a match on Cumberland's turf field against Shell Lake. Team captains were Lucas Reuter, Brett Bartlett, and Freddie Nelson. Several athletes received all-conference honors, including Leif Lahti (1st Team Offense & Honorable Mention Defense), Freddie Nelson (2nd Team Defense & Honorable Mention Offense), Riley Cummings (2nd Team Offense & Honorable Mention Defense), and Brett Bartlett (Honorable Mention Offense & Defense).

Volleyball: This year, the Volleyball team was notably young, with several athletes experiencing varsity play for the first time. They celebrated their first victory against Butternut during a tournament in Winter. The girls demonstrated remarkable progress throughout the season and will return their entire roster next year. The team captains were Maggie Wooten, Kenna Chenal, and Taylor Hansford.

Frederic School District Report Card

We have had a wonderful fall at Frederic Schools. As a learning community, we continually strive to improve and refine our instructional methods. One resource we use to assess our strengths and identify areas for improvement is the school report card, which was released on November 19, 2024.

The District's schools, and each school's most recent state-assigned performance category (if available), are listed below:

ACT 20 is an early literacy law that requires all Wisconsin public schools to administer the same early literacy skills screener three times a year from 4K to 3rd grade. This year, the state has provided a Pearson resource called AimsWebPLUS. The Frederic School District has successfully maintained the practice of literacy and math screeners for many years, utilizing a Renaissance product known as Fastbridge. This fall, all teachers and associate staff working with 4K-3rd grade students were trained and prepared for the transition to AimsWebPLUS. Students will be experiencing this new type of screener in December, allowing grade level teams the ability to analyze the new data during a January in-service. Any student performing below the 25th percentile will be assigned a Personal Reading Plan. Targeted interventions are administered daily and progress monitored each week within a ten week cycle, providing each individual student and family customized literacy support.
